# What is going on behind the scenes at the RTBCA.

The Board of Directors is working hard to meet the requirements for the club's ability to apply for full AKC recognition. The Items that are listed are being completed by the Board of Directors and our goal is to apply for full AKC recognition within the next 18 months. As a requirement, the club cannot apply for AKC full recognition before all these items have been completed and one year has passed since the breed has been in the Miscellaneous class.

### 1. The club must host two AKC OPEN shows available to all FSS/MISC breeds.

a. The first OPEN show is being held December 1, 2023, in Conroe, Texas. We look forward to an entry of several FSS/Miscellaneous breeds in the Midwest.b. The second OPEN show is being planned. More updates later in the year.

### 2. Three Judges Education Seminars. This is done by approved Board Members.

a. The first Judges education seminar was completed in March 2023.

b. The board has the second Judges Education seminar scheduled December 2023.

c. The third will be held in Phoenix AZ in February 2024.

# 3. Judges Education course development for AKC Canine College in collaboration with AKC.

a. Our Secretary and President are in contact with AKC on getting this started. This is a process that takes months of preparation. Updates will be posted as they become available.

### 4. Complete a Policy and Procedure Manual for the club.

a. This has been recently completed and will be reviewed by the Board of Directors before submission to the AKC.

- 1. Encourage others to register their Bolonka with the AKC
- 2. Encourage Bolonka Owners to Join the RTBCA
- 3. Encourage Bolonka Owners to compete in AKC events.
- 4. Establish local specialty clubs for the breed and get approved by the RTBCA.

Orange County Convention Center ~ Orlando, FL December 16 & 17, 2023





### OPEN SHOW vs MISCELLANEOUS CLASS

The Bolonka became eligible for the Miscellaneous Class effective January 1, 2023, thus giving additional opportunities to gain points toward a Certificate of Merit title. This article assists in explaining the difference between the two events and how to calculate points.

**Open Show:** the AKC Open show was designed to give the Foundation Stock and Miscellaneous breeders and owners the opportunity to present their breeds to the public and to receive a Certificate of Merit suffix title on their dog. The AKC Open show is divided into two separate groups: the Foundation Stock breeds and the Miscellaneous breeds. Each breed competes for Best of Breed and Best of Opposite Sex.

**Foundation Stock Classes:** The Best of Breed winner of each Foundation Stock breed will compete for Best of Foundation Stock. The group winner will then compete against the winner of the Miscellaneous Class for Best in Open Conference.

**Miscellaneous Classes:** The Best of Breed winner of each Miscellaneous breed will compete for Best of Miscellaneous Classes. The group winner will then compete against the winner from Foundation Stock class for Best in Open Conference.

Points are earned by the number of dogs entered at the breed, and group level with a maximum of 5 points available per show. See point scale below.

All Breed Shows: The AKC All Breed show will offer classes to the Miscellaneous breeds. The classes are explained below along with how points are earned toward the CM title.

**Miscellaneous Classes :** These classes are for Miscellaneous breeds only. Each breed will compete for Best of Breed within their breed. Once those winners are determined, each breed will then compete for Best Miscellaneous. See Point scale below.

The Bolonkas are a Miscellaneous breed and therefore are given multiple opportunities to earn points toward the CM title. If the host club offers an OPEN show and All Breed Show the Bolonka can be entered and shown in both events, giving them two chances for points in the same day.
